Rigoberto González is the author four books of poetry and ten books of prose and editor of two collections. The recipient of Guggenheim, NEA and other fellowships, grants, and awards, he is contributing editor for *Poets & Writers Magazine* and is professor of English at Rutgers-Newark, the State University of New Jersey. As of 2016, he serves as critic-at-large with the *Los Angeles Times* and sits on the Board of Trustees of the Association of Writers and Writing Programs (AWP). He earned graduate degrees from the University of California, Davis, and Arizona State University in Tempe.
